We will start to look at mass, length, capacity and time and begin to compare these using everyday and simple mathematical language. We will extend our knowledge of shape to begin to explore shape. We will continue to investigate and explore patterns.

The Great Outdoors

After Christmas we will be beginning to explore anything and everything in the outside world focusing in particular on seasonal change. We will investigate the signs of Winter during the colder months of January and February, looking at how different materials are affected by temperature such as water. We will begin to look at how different animals survive in winter, looking at habitats and different foods. We will compare the climate of our own environment with those around the world, using the immersive suite to experience various habitats such as the jungle, under the sea, mountains and even a trip to Antarctica!

As the weather warms up after February half term, we will be spending more and more time outside. We will investigate plants and animals as well as seasonal change. We will look at the life cycles of some animals and how plants grow. We will have a go at planting our own plants and taking care of them. We will read some exciting stories linked to this topic such as Jack and the Beanstalk.
