Horizon Schools Federation Birthday

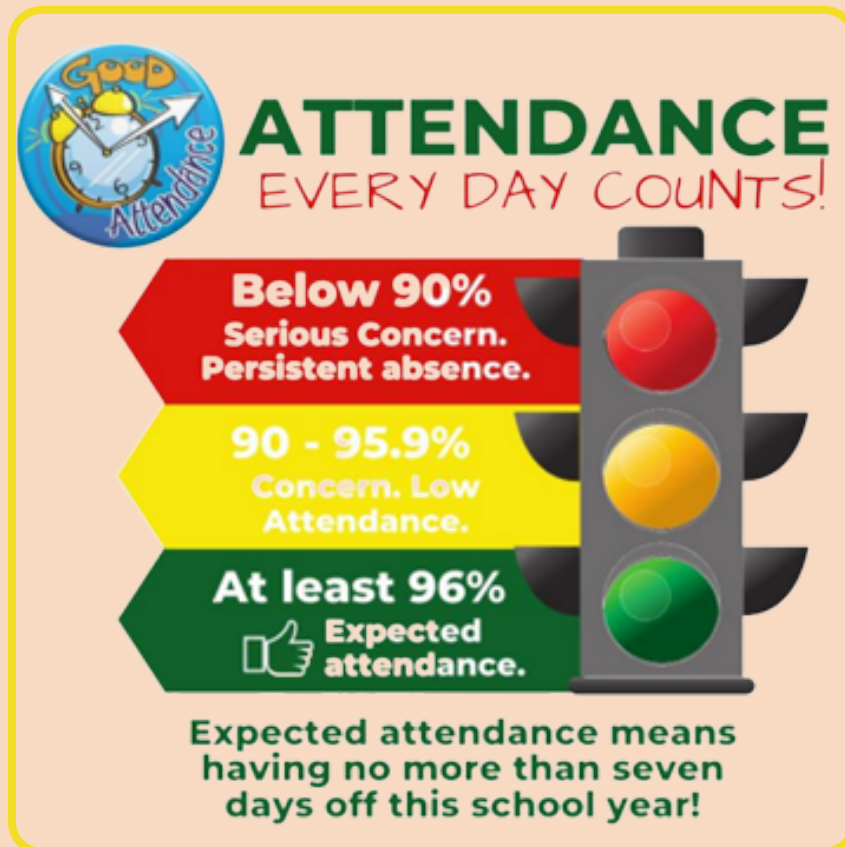
Horizon Schools Federation turned 1 years old on Thursday 26th February 2026.

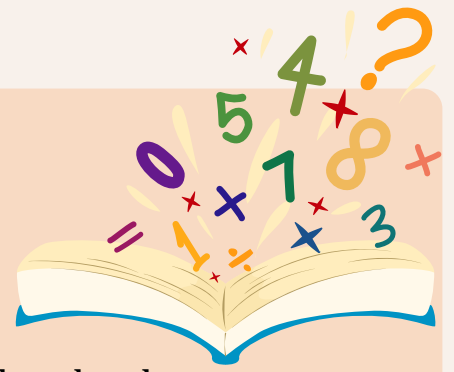

Maths

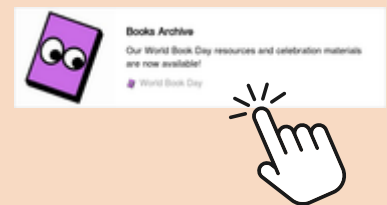

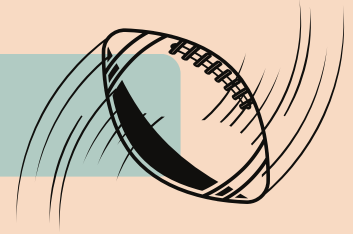
School Council would also like to hold a bake sale after school on Friday 20th March with all donations going to Comic Relief.
